About Celebrate Cayman 60 Acts of Service

Presented by Celebrate Cayman, this 60 Acts of Service initiative is part of a growing global movement changing how people collaborate and interact with each other, and their communities. It's a global movement of **civic action** and **engagement**.

This initiative brings together a wide variety of groups including residents, neighbourhood associations, arts and environmental organisations, anchor institutions, community councils, small businesses and more. Celebrate Cayman 60 Acts of Service inspires residents and visitors to activate 60 innovative, thought-provoking ideas into projects that will transform our islands in just one weekend.

On 1-2 June, residents and visitors on all three islands will transform their communities through 60 simple, low-cost projects: actions, events, or installations that are free, open to anyone, and designed to create positive change, inspire action and connection in their neighbourhoods.

Projects can be practical: planting trees, or cleaning up a park.

Projects can be social: a neighbourhood potluck, or a community open mic night. Projects can challenge us, aim to serve underprivileged communities, or bring awareness to social issues.

The effect of the Celebrate Cayman 60 Acts of Service extends beyond 1 and 2 June. Though the emphasis of the Celebrate Cayman 60 Acts of Service is on small actions, it is part of a movement that challenges the entrenched cynicism and culture of risk aversion that says regular people can't get involved or have an impact on their communities. The result of hundreds of people coming together to make a difference can extend well beyond the weekend celebration – it can inspire people to act, build connections and capacities, develop innovative solutions, and even support policy change by the scaling of these temporary actions into longstanding projects.

Celebrate Cayman 60 Acts of Service offers participants many benefits including opportunities to practice or learn new skills, to be a part of a larger community-based movement, to have an impact and contribute positively to their community, to challenge cynicism and embrace hope, to do something creative and exciting, to meet new people and to make new connections.

After participating in similar initiatives around the world, project leaders and organisations have reported feeling reduced fear around active participation, a desire to use their experience to inspire others, more confidence in their ability to have an impact and have formed stronger networks and ties to the community. These projects impact at the community level by enhancing neighbourhoods and spawning new ideas, solutions and initiatives. They inspire dialogue, challenge the status quo and raise awareness of new possibilities.

Celebrate Cayman 60 Acts of Service Principles

Celebrate Cayman 60 Acts of Service is all about your ideas; however, we ask that you follow these guiding principles when designing your project.

Celebrate Cayman 60 Acts of Service is a platform for action – where citizens, residents, neighbours, communities and organisations (aka: you!) are the catalyst for change. Celebrate Cayman 60 Acts of Service invites individuals and organisations to showcase active citizenship, and encourages distributed leadership.

As project leaders and participants, you should assume responsibility for the project. This includes the personal and public welfare in creating and launching the intervention, and in the care and clean-up of the intervention.

Celebrate Cayman 60 Acts of Service projects should:

- Inspire inclusive projects that respond to community needs and make our islands a better place to live, work and play
- Build and foster community networks
- Be non-partisan and non-commercial
- Have free participation. These projects are people-powered acts in which no fees or charges are to be collected, nor should a project be tied to commercially-driven activities.

Responsibilities. Expectations. Support.

Project Champions are responsible for:

- designing the project
- creating and launching the project
- actively engaging diverse audiences in volunteer recruitment
- support promotional efforts of Celebrate Cayman by sharing communications with network via website, social media, newsletters, at regular meetings, etc
- delivering the project on the weekend of 1 and 2 June 2019
- funding the project
- ensuring project is safe for you and participants
- cleaning up the project at the end of the day
- submitting the post-project feedback and success report no later than 5 June 2019
